DO YOU HAVE PAIN AND DIFFICULTY WITH SWALLOWING? YOU MIGHT BE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN A CLINICAL TRIAL

Eosinophilic Esophagitis (EoE) is a condition of the esophagus (tube from your mouth to stomach) that can lead to difficulty swallowing and causing food to get stuck in your throat while swallowing. A type of white blood cell, called an eosinophil, builds up in the lining of your esophagus and causes inflammation. *Eupraxia Pharmaceuticals* is conducting a clinical study to test a new treatment called EP-104IAR which has been formulated as an injection into the esophagus aimed to help those experiencing these symptoms of EoE.



WHO IS ELIGIBLE

Male and female patients of age 18 years to 75 years old who have been diagnosed with Eosinophilic Esophagitis and have active symptoms of Eosinophilic Esophagitis.
