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About Us

Founded in 2009, ausEE Inc. is a registered Australia wide charity and national support and patient advocacy organisation representing Australians living with an eosinophilic disease. ausEE is predominantly run by volunteers with approximately 3,500 members, extending its outreach to individuals, families, hospitals, health professionals, peak bodies, stakeholders and the wider community.

WHAT ARE EOSINOPHILIC DISEASES?

Eosinophils are a type of white blood cell that play a role in certain medical conditions and immune responses. If a person has too many eosinophils, it may be a sign of an eosinophil-associated disease. The eosinophils build up and can cause inflammation and tissue damage. The diagnosis depends on where in the body the eosinophils are found.


Eosinophilic gastrointestinal diseases (EGIDs) are eosinophilic diseases where the eosinophils are found in increased numbers in the

gastrointestinal tract. Eosinophilic oesophagitis (EoE), the most recognised form of EGID, has become one of the fastest-growing diseases over the past two decades. It has an estimated prevalence of 1 in 1,000 and an estimated 26,000 Australians living with the disease. EoE is a progressive disease where the inflammation can lead to scarring, strictures and narrowing of the oesophagus, putting people at risk of food impactions (food getting stuck in the oesophagus).

Eosinophilic diseases are chronic diseases that can significantly impact quality of life and require ongoing care, repeated visits to multiple healthcare professionals, emergency departments and hospitals. The symptoms can be debilitating and often result in social, emotional, and financial challenges for patients and their families.



AUSEE MEDICAL RESEARCH FUND

ausEE's Medical Research Fund supports <u>research projects</u> focused on improving the diagnosis, management and treatment options for eosinophilic diseases. These research grants are made possible through the generous donations of our supporters and our annual <u>Top 8 Challenge</u> fundraising campaign.

In 2023/2024, the following research grants were disbursed from ausEE's Medical Research Fund:

\$10,000 - The University of Newcastle

Professor Guy Eslick, Professor Mike Jones, Professor Marjorie Walker and Professor Nicholas J. Talley for continuation of their research project titled 'Are disorders of gut-brain interaction (DGBI) due to EGIDs'.

\$9,000 - Southern Cross University

Nicole Hannan for a pilot feasibility trial of Meriva[®] curcumin phytosome[®] for adults with eosinophilic oesophagitis (EoE).



RESEARCH PROJECT

Home Enteral Nutrition Quality of Life

This study was conducted by Dr Mercedez Hinchcliff, a researcher at the University of Wollongong and President of ausEE Inc. The purpose of this research was to investigate tube feeding and elemental formula use in Australia/New Zealand and health-related quality of life. A <u>Summary of Survey Results</u> from this research were released during Feeding Tube Awareness Week 2024.

At the AGW 2024 conference a poster from this research titled 'Evaluating Quality of Life in patients who use Home Enteral Nutrition in Australia/New Zealand' was presented and the abstract subsequently published in the Journal of Gastroenterology and Hepatology <u>AGW24 Supplement</u>, Nutrition section.

Future Goals

ausEE Inc. envisages a future where people affected by eosinophilic diseases have timely access to consistent care, are well-supported within their communities, and benefit from greater awareness and understanding of their conditions. We are a national charity that receives no government funding, and as such, we rely on our fundraising and the generosity of our supporters to support the work of our mission.

ausEE's mission is to improve the lives of those affected by eosinophilic diseases through providing support, evidence-based information, resources, advocacy and by campaigning to raise awareness and funds for research in Australia.

Our resources are limited, and we continue to seek support from the Australian Government for the development and implementation of initiatives that address core issues for our patient community and offer solutions to help to provide a better future for Australians living with eosinophilic diseases.

Key Issues and Solutions

Lack of National Standards of Care - There are currently no formal guidelines for eosinophilic disease management in Australia, leading to inconsistent care. ausEE recommends developing National Standards of Care through collaboration with key medical organisations and stakeholders to ensure consistent, patient-centred, and effective long-term care.

Delays in diagnosis - Many patients experience long delays between symptom onset and diagnosis. This can worsen disease outcomes and increase the burden on healthcare services. ausEE calls for the development of a clearly defined referral and diagnosis pathway, supported by medical bodies and health services, to facilitate earlier and more accurate diagnoses.

Access to support services - People living with eosinophilic diseases often face daily challenges that benefit from strong community support. ausEE proposes expanding peer-led support networks, especially in regional and remote areas, and developing patient toolkits with clear, accessible information and access to mental health support.

Low awareness and education - Despite ausEE's efforts, awareness of eosinophilic diseases remains low among both the public and health professionals. To address this, ausEE plans to expand outreach to hospitals and clinics across Australia, broaden educational resources to cover a range of eosinophil-associated diseases, and grow our national awareness campaigns.

Notes to the Financial Statements ausEE Inc. for the year ended 30 June 2024

1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act Queensland. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

Cash on Hand

Cash on hand includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognizing revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.


